Merced County Fair Guide for First Time Exhibitors

Q: Who Can Enter Exhibits?

A: *Anyone. However, you must be the owner of and the individual, who grew, built, created or raised the exhibit you want to enter.*

Q: What does it cost to enter?

A: *Most still exhibits (non-livestock) open class departments have no entry fees. See individual department listings for specific information.*

Q: Can I enter exhibits in more than one department?

A: *Yes, but most departments limit the number of entries per class from any one individual. Individuals are not, however, limited to the number of departments in which they May submit entries. **Each department** requires an individual entry form which can be downloaded from our website or is in the back of the book.*

Q: How far in advance must I enter an exhibit?

A: *Deadlines vary for individual departments. Refer to the Dates To Know.*

Q: I have an unusual item that I'd like to enter, but don't see a category for it in the handbook. How can I enter my item?

A: *We welcome and encourage unusual projects. Contact the fair office and we will help guide you to the correct department.*

Q: What types of awards/ribbons can I win?

A: *The types of awards and ribbons vary by department. Some departments give nominal cash premiums and others ribbon only.*

Q: How are the exhibits judged?

A: *There are two types of judging systems used at the fair, the American and Danish Systems.*

- *Under the American System, the judges evaluate all exhibits in the department and selects only one first, one second, one third and so on in each department*
- *Under the Danish System, judges evaluate each exhibit on its own merits (not compared to others) and may give more than one first, second, third or so on.*

Q: Whom do I call if I have questions?

A: *Call the Administration Office at 209-722-1506 and we will be glad to help. You can also go on-line for more information and set up an exhibitor account.*

Q: What do I do when I bring my exhibit to the Fairgrounds?

A: *Each department will have signs posted in the front of the building or Fair personnel will direct you to the appropriate building. Be sure to refer to the entry dates and times that are listed in the handbook.*

Please Note: The Fair makes every effort to ensure that the information provided in the exhibitor handbook is accurate and free of typographical errors regarding the awarding of premiums and prizes. The Fair will not be held responsible for awarding duplicate premiums. The Fair will not be held responsible for items that have been disqualified at the judge's discretion.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

Remember – If you don't see a class that meets your exact needs, you can always use "Any Other". Our goal is to increase competition and make it easy for EVERYONE to enter!

FIRST:

1. Look through the on-line Exhibitor Handbook and find the areas that you are interested in entering. There should be a division and class for just about anything.
2. This book is published and posted online yearly and lists all the departments, divisions and classes that are available for entry.

SECOND:

1. Enter still exhibits online at www.mercedcountyfair.com or in the fair office.
2. Enter the classes you feel best suited for your exhibit. The Fair will attempt to enter exhibits in the proper classes when entries are made in error on the form, however, the Fair will not be liable for entries made in error.
3. Refer to the RULES listed in the department you are entering for further information. If you need help, call the fair office at (209) 722-1507 or come in and see us Monday through Friday 8:00 am to 5:00 pm
4. If there are entry fees, you will need to pay them online.
5. **All entries must be entered by the deadline date. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

THIRD, bring your exhibits to the Fairgrounds. Be sure you have noted the receiving days as listed in our online premium book.

GLOSSARY OR TERMINOLOGY:

ADVANCED / PROFESSIONAL: Exhibitor who has achieved a marked degree of expertise in the division or who has sold or made money from their work.

BEGINNER: Exhibitor who has two years or less experience in division.

DISABILITIES/CHALLENGED EXHIBITORS: For persons with learning, developmental or physical disabilities and enrolled in a group facility or Adult Day Program.

INTERMEDIATE: Exhibitor who has two years or more experience in the division.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR: Persons 19 years of age and younger

SENIOR EXHIBITOR: Persons 20 years of age and older

LOCAL RULES

1. **NEW THIS YEAR FOR STILL EXHIBITS** - All entries can be entered on-line or in the fair office.
2. **CLOSING DATES:** The management reserves the right to close a class before closing date in the event that all available space has been allotted or to extend closing date, by Board approval, if, prior to the closing date, sufficient entries for proper competition have not been received.
3. All entries will be under the direction of the superintendent of several departments. The fair management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that May occur.
4. All entries are entered at the exhibitor's risk.
5. No exhibit may be removed before 9:00 am on Monday after the Fair has ended.
6. Under no circumstances will a judge award a prize for any entry that does not merit such award. This applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.
7. There must be two or more classes in a division in order to qualify for "best in division" awards.
8. The areas from which entries will be accepted in local and extended classes are designated at department, division, or class headings.
9. The State Rules, Species Rules, Health Rules, and Judging Standards as prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Expositions and published in a separate booklet available at the fair office apply to all entries of this fair.
10. All artwork unclaimed 5 days after the removal date becomes the property of the Merced County Fair and will be disposed of unless specific arrangements are made with the Building Superintendent.
11. Unless otherwise noted, entries are limited to residents of Merced, Madera, Mariposa and Stanislaus Counties.
12. Please note: The Fair makes every effort to ensure that the information provided in the exhibitor handbook is accurate and free of typographical errors regarding the awarding of premiums and prizes. The Fair will not be held responsible for awarding duplicate premiums or for items that have been disqualified at the judge's discretion.

JUDGING SYSTEMS

American - The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first place, one second place, one third place, etc.

Danish - The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against a scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first place, second place, etc., as merited.

It will be at the judge's discretion to not award a placing if not merited.

In all Departments using the Danish System, the following guidelines shall be used by judges:

RULES:

1. Unless otherwise noted, the following applies to all entries in the Agriculture - Horticulture Department. Entries are expected to be judged according to commercial maturity standards. The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market and such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for premium awards.
2. Exhibits stressing features that detract from the commercial value of any produce are undesirable and should be avoided. Any frozen fruit or vegetables will be disqualified.

Section 42513:

“Mature” means having reached that state of ripeness which will ensure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.”

Section 42515:

“Overripe” means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.”

FRUIT, VEGETABLE AND NUT DIVISIONS

NOTE: Unless otherwise stated, the type of vegetable desired for the exhibit will be uniform commercial grade rather than overgrown. Monstrosities will not be considered for premium awards. There must be 2 or more entries per Division for awards.

RULES:

1. Limited to Merced County, Madera County, and Stanislaus County Residents, 19 years and older.
2. Variety of products must be adequately and correctly labeled.
3. Exhibitors are limited to two entries per class unless otherwise noted.

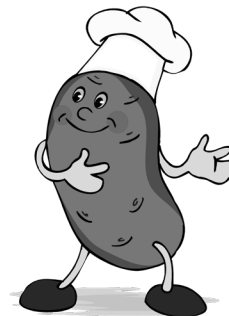

7. The garden area will be open for construction starting Wednesday, May 29 to Tuesday, June 4 from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm
8. **Gardens must be the workmanship of exhibitors only. You must supply all your supplies and your own assistance.**
9. Judging will take place June 5. Gardens must be ready for JUDGING by 8:00 pm, June 4.
10. Accessories permitted in all gardens. All motor driven/electrical equipment (pumps, lights, etc.) used in gardens must continue operating for duration of fair. Failure to comply may result in premiums being withheld.
11. Each exhibitor is to provide a plot plan for display, to include botanical and common names for plant identification.
12. Structures may not be erected enclosing the garden area. This does not preclude use of fencing material not to exceed 3' in height and in good taste.
13. Dried materials used in gardens must either be flameproof or treated with a flame-retardant solution.

FFA MEMBERS: Limited to students in Merced County High Schools unless otherwise noted. FFA members may participate as members until the end of the calendar year following the year of graduation from high school.

4-H MEMBERS: Limited to 4-H Clubs located in Merced County. 4-H members may enroll if they are 9 years old or in the 4th grade by December 31, 2023, and can exhibit as a member until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 19. **Second and third graders**, officially enrolled in 4-H, may exhibit in special divisions designated for 4-H Mini-Members.

INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS: Limited to residents of Merced County, unless otherwise noted, who not members of FFA or 4-H. Exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2024. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.

Independent junior exhibitors must enter an open junior class unless one is not available. If open junior classes are not available, junior exhibitors may enter appropriate FFA or 4-H classes if they meet all appropriate age and State Rule requirements.

Exhibitor graduated from 8th grade through 12th grade will compete within the FFA Divisions. Juniors who have been FFA or 4-H project members within 60 days prior to the fair are not eligible to compete in those projects as independent juniors. An FFA or 4-H member may exhibit as an independent junior if that exhibitor is not, or has not been, enrolled in an FFA or 4-H project that pertains to that exhibit during the current year.

RULES:

1. **CLOSING DATES:** The management reserves the right to close a class before closing date in the event that all available space has been allotted or to extend closing date, by Board approval, if, prior to closing date, sufficient entries for proper competition have not been received.
2. All entries will be under the direction of the superintendent of the several departments. The fair management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
3. All entries are entered at the exhibitor's risk.
4. No still exhibit may be removed before 9:00 am, Monday, June 10, 2024.
5. RULES governing the Senior Department also apply to Junior Departments unless otherwise noted.
6. Forms for entries in 4-H and FFA must be signed by exhibitor's leader or advisor. However, only 4-H leaders and FFA advisors registered with the Merced County Fair will be authorized to sign entry forms. Lack of authorized signature shall make the exhibit ineligible.
7. Each entry in "independent junior" divisions shall have been made or produced by the exhibitor. The signature of a parent or guardian is required. State and Local Rules apply to all entries and scorecards in corresponding Senior and Junior Department classes shall be used unless otherwise provided in these divisions.
8. Junior exhibitors and junior organizations may be allowed to enter exhibits in Senior Department classes for which they are eligible ONLY when a class for the exhibit is not provided in the Junior Department.
9. Entries may not be made in the Senior Department to circumvent the limitation of State Rules. All State Rules for California Fairs apply. A copy of the State Rules for California Fairs may be obtained at www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe/
10. There must be two or more exhibitors in a division in order to qualify for "best in division" awards.
11. The areas from which entries will be accepted in local and extended classes are designated at department, division or class headings.
12. All artwork unclaimed after removal date becomes the property of the Merced County Fair and will be disposed of unless specific arrangements are made with the Building Superintendent.
13. Unless otherwise noted, entries are limited to residents of Merced County, Madera County and Stanislaus County.

JUDGING SYSTEMS

American - The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first place, one second place, one third place, etc.

Danish - The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against a scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first place, second place, etc., as merited.

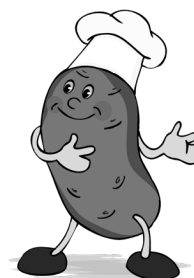

9. An appropriate amount of headspace for the product canned should be allowed. Leave ¼-inch headspace for soft spreads and pickled foods (except sauerkraut); ½-inch headspace for fruits, tomatoes and sauerkraut; 1-inch headspace for vegetables.
10. Product pieces should be uniform in size and packed snugly but allow for circulation of liquids. Liquids should cover the product, keeping within the headspace guidelines. Liquids should be clear and free from cloudiness and small particles.
